The CALS Program was started in 1996 in Minnesota by a grassroots coalition of volunteer health care providers who had the goal of improving patient care and outcomes in rural settings. Now in its sixteenth year, the CALS Program has developed satellite programs in three other states (Wisconsin, Missouri, and Texas) and has hosted courses in many additional states and eight countries. The CALS Program extends its reach in training all embassy medical personnel around the globe for the US Department of State.

CALS Hospital Requirements

Facilities across the US and Canada can earn CALS Hospital recognition by completing the following steps:

- Provide CALS training for all emergency care team leaders, or 75% of provider staff (Physicians, NPs, PAs)
- Provide CALS training for all RNs in emergency care, or 75% of all clinical staff (RNs, LPNs, CRNAs, Paramedics)
- Procure the emergency medical equipment recommended by CALS for effective emergency care
- Participate in CALS outcome and data collection within the prescribed boundaries of confidentiality (optional)
