The CALS Program was started in 1996 in Minnesota by a grassroots coalition of volunteer health care providers who had the goal of improving patient care and outcomes in rural settings. Now in its sixteenth year, the CALS Program has developed satellite programs in three other states (Wisconsin, Missouri, and Texas) and has hosted courses in many additional states and eight countries. The CALS Program extends its reach in training all embassy medical personnel around the globe for the US Department of State.

CALS education and resources were designed for physicians, physician assistants, nurse practitioners, RNs, LPNs, and allied health care professionals (eg, CRNAs and paramedics) who work in rural, remote, or global settings. The CALS Provider Course:  
*"Hands-on" Comprehensive Advanced Life Support education that prepares your team for rural emergencies.*

The CALS Provider Course is an educational program designed specifically for rural health care providers to meet their emergency medical training needs. It teaches an effective approach to the care of critically ill/injured patients manifesting a wide range of emergencies including trauma, cardiac, strokes, pediatric, OB, neonatal, airway compromise, and sepsis.

The course is most typically taught in the rural or remote facility, where resources are limited. More than 96% of participants report that taking the CALS course enhanced their skills, confidence and teamwork abilities, leaving them better prepared to treat critically ill or injured patients.

**Who should attend?**

Providers are encouraged to attend in teams consisting of a team leader (usually a physician), other physicians, physician assistants, nurse practitioners, nurses, and other allied health professionals (e.g. CRNAs).

Courses are limited to 24 participants per session.

CALS Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the Provider Course, students will be able to:

- Demonstrate the ability to problem solve in a variety of clinical situations.
- Identify key threats and demonstrate appropriate therapeutic interventions.
- Discuss roles of each team member involved in patient evaluation and treatment.
- Perform skills consistent with the provider's role on the advanced life support team.
